Dearly Beloved Parishioners,

May the peace and joy of Christ be with you.

Jesus Christ filled with the Spirit begun his ministry by saying: "the time has come and the Kingdom of God is at hand, repent and believe the good news" (Mk. 1:14-15, Mtt.4:17)

What is this Kingdom of God which Jesus keeps talking about? St. Paul says in Romans, the Kingdom of God is "... righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Rom14:17).

Jesus Christ is the one appointed by God as shepherd after his own heart, who will shepherd His people wisely and prudently (Jer.3:14ff). He is the "Sun of righteousness referred to in Malachi 4:2, and called "the Lord of righteousness" by the prophet Jeremiah (Jer.23:6). He is also called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, everlasting Father and Prince of Peace, by the prophet Isaiah (Is. 9:6). He is the posterity of David whom God found 'a man after my own heart who will do all my will'. (Acts 13:22ff)

Beloved, eternal life is knowing the one true God, and Jesus Christ whom God had sent to the world (cf. John 17:3). Christ Jesus is the word of God. Listening to the word of God and pondering over the word day and night with understanding heart [Love] will bring transformation into our life, so that in all things God will reign in us in righteousness and bring us peace and Joy in the holy Spirit.

Brothers and sisters seek first the Kingdom of God and its righteousness and all other things shall come along with it. For all things were created through the Word of God. Solomon asked for an Understanding heart and he was blessed in abundance with the wealth and wisdom of the world. Someone found the Kingdom of God (a treasure and the precious pearl) and he sells all that he has and buys it.

There is nothing more precious and lasting in this world than the word of God taking flesh and living among us. Loving anything more the word of God is not worthy of the kingdom of God. For all things will pass away, but the word is eternal life.

St Paul says in our second reading of today, 'that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose'. And the will of God is that we should be saved and conformed to the image of His Son, Christ Jesus. In other words, our life should be modelled by the word of God. To Love God, therefore is to keep his commandment [The Word].

We can therefore hope in the glory of heaven promised by God to those who love him and do his will. In every circumstance, each one of us should hope, with the grace of God, to persevere "to the end" and to obtain the joy of heaven, as God's eternal reward for the good works accomplished with the grace of Christ. In hope, the Church prays for "all men to be saved." She longs to be united with Christ, her Bridegroom, in the glory of heaven: Hope, O my soul, hope. You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly, even though your impatience makes doubtful what is certain, and turns a very short time into a long one. Dream that the more you struggle, the more you prove the love that you bear your God, and the more you will rejoice one day with your Beloved, in a happiness and rapture that can never end. (CCC,1821)

God love you all. Stay forever blessed and remain in God's love and care.
