11th SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME – 13TH JUNE 2021 MESSAGE FROM FR. EDMUND

Dearly Beloved Parishioners,

Rejoice in the Lord always. Again, I say Rejoice!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that: "God is the sovereign master of His plan. But to carry it out he also makes use of his creatures' co-operation. This use is not a sign of weakness, but rather a token of Almighty God's greatness and goodness. For God grants his creatures not only their existence, but also the dignity of acting on their own, of being causes and principles for each other, and thus of co-operating in the accomplishment of his plan." (CCC 306)

My dear people of God: Today's Readings encourage us to have Hope in the Lord's plan for our lives and patiently wait for it to unfold. The Prophet Ezekiel, in the first reading, carries a message of hope to all God's people. As a point of reference, he describes how God will take a seemingly weak part of a tree, and transform it into a magnificent tree.

In his second letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul expressed his message of hope in the confidence that faith in Christ positions us for faithful service that pleases the Lord. And that the reward for our faith, which is eternal life with Christ Jesus, is worth the waiting.

In the Gospel Christ Jesus, in His parables, likens the Kingdom of God to the process of sowing a seed and watching it grow to full maturity. This process, like following in the footsteps of Christ, requires patience and a living hope.

The first parable shows how the invisible action of the Holy Spirit causes growth of the Kingdom of God. Over a period of time, the extension of the Kingdom becomes quite noticeable. The second parable, however, expresses how the Kingdom of God, like the mustard seed, starts off very small but grows to mighty proportions, having an effect on the entire world.

Beloved in Christ, everything big has a small beginning. It is no different with the kingdom of God. The seed of Christian faith was sowed like the mustard seed in the heart of twelve Apostles. This mustard seed-like faith was nurtured by unalloyed determination and courage, obedience to the promptings of the Spirit, love, prayer, and community life.

Let us reflect on some of the lessons we can learn from this parable. The parable of the growing seed is an invitation to be hopeful in the Lord at all times. We should have no reason to become discouraged in life because of "our smallness". Even though we might occasionally feel insignificant, unnoticed, unappreciated, we should never forget that the once smallest seed became the biggest shrub. What once needed protection and tender care became a source of protection and care. When we are uncertain about our future and are unable to see much of our hidden potentials, we have no reason to give up. It is God who gives the little mustard seed the capacity to grow into the biggest tree in whose shade the birds of the sky can nest and find shelter. In life, hope is the only thing that can help us get through the darkest of times. It is the ability to anticipate light despite all of the darkness that surrounds us. The parable of the mustard seed must help us renew our hopes and aspirations. There will always be occasions and moments that seek to frustrate our inner motivations and desires, but in all these we are to let our hopes, not our hurts, shape our lives and our future. It will be a mistake to ever look for hope outside of yourself; genuine hope comes from within, and hope is the last thing ever lost.

The parable of the growing seed is also a call to be patient with the Lord and the laws of life. With the Lord, nothing can be forced, only expected. This requires a great deal of patience and perseverance. Jesus invites us to wait on God who creates and sustains life in all dignity. God Love You! United in prayer
